We have some serious and exciting news to share! Once again African Enterprise is ready to embark on an historic mission outreach in Southern Sudan.

YOU have the opportunity to impact this unique evangelistic and service opportunity with your gift.

First let me tell you about the situation in Sudan. This is heart-wrenching stuff.

Oil was found in the south by the Muslim government based in the north. They needed to clear the way for oil extraction and a pipeline to the north coast. Western and Eastern super-powers bought the oil and Canadians built the pipeline. The South wanted a share of the oil revenue, the North said no and sent Troops and helicopter gunships to bomb and strafe the southern villages.



Thousands died and many more fled. A whole generation of children has grown up amid landmines, invading tanks and militia forcing them to become child-soldiers.



James, now 40, was taken as a child and taught to kill. He was “on the notorious death march Where he and other young Sudanese boy’s walked a thousand miles to flee the genocide” wrote an observer. “He spoke of drinking urine to stay alive. He spoke of watching others die while hundreds of thousands fled to the Darfur region of Sudan and surrounding countries.” An estimated 3 million+ have died and it must stop!

Sadly, this – and even worse – is the tortured story of the people of Juba in Southern Sudan. Decades of genocidal war forced upon them by the Arab and Muslim Northern Sudanese military have left behind trauma, bitterness and hardly any infrastructure.

That’s why AE is staging a Kingdom counter-invasion of Juba!

Capitalizing on a fragile peace, we will send in our most experienced evangelists from September 12–19 to rescue the shell-shocked residents from despair.

We are praying and believing that thousands of Sudanese will give their broken lives to Jesus Christ and that God will heal them and their nation, and through it be glorified!

For the first time they'll know joy and release from the wounds of the past. And they'll become salt and light – agents of Gospel healing and hope in a parched and pummelled land.



But there's no way we can succeed in taking Christ's good news to our ailing brothers and sisters in Sudan if you're not involved with us. That's why I know you'll want to pray and give generously so that these suffering people can finally be brought to Jesus.

We believe so strongly in the Mission to Juba and we are believing God for miracles beyond measure!

We need a total of \$100,000 for this whole mission and Canada has been asked to raise \$25,000. That is our prayerful commitment to making it happen. But time is short as the preparations are building.

Along with plans to preach the gospel we have been working with leaders in Juba, Southern Sudan related to peace-building and mediation. The city is where a million people live and is regarded as the capital of the South.

We are trusting God that the lasting legacy will be transformed lives leading to reconciliation and peace in this troubled land.

- the political situation - praise God for the recent elections which were miraculously peaceful.
- the involvement and enthusiasm of key Church leaders in the city who will be spearheading the mission and leading their congregations to participate.
- the protection and preparation of the Pan African Mission set-up team and the African & International evangelists, led by Stephen Lungu and the AE Mission Team to preach His word throughout the city.
- healing of the population, traumatized from the long civil war.
- the Christian group at the University of Juba who are boldly witnessing and ministering amongst an increasing Muslim population.
- all the resources needed for this 'Kingdom counter-invasion' of Juba in Southern Sudan.
